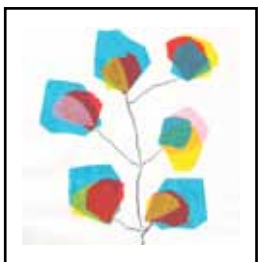


### 14 Years and Up Category "Sweet Pea Interweave"

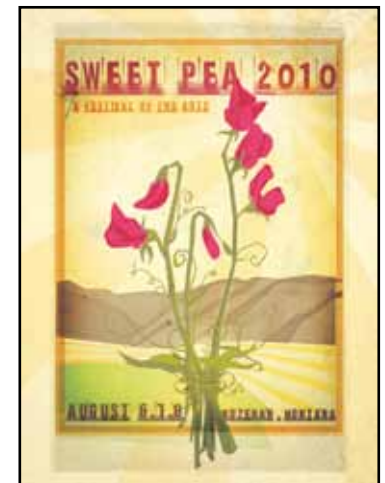

Hour, among others. In 2008 and 2009, Carrie was named Roots Music Association's Folk Songwriter of the Year.

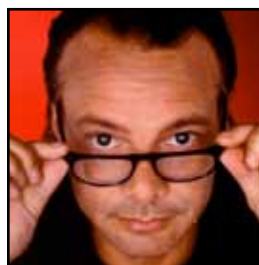


### Big Bad Voodoo Daddy

Since their arrival on the music scene in 1993 in a legendary residency at Los Angeles' Brown Derby nightclub, Big Bad Voodoo Daddy's irresistible live show and aggressive, musically perceptive approach has proven them over time to be the singular standout

among the numerous bands that launched the nineties swing revival. The group forged a massively successful fusion of classic American sounds from jazz, swing, Dixieland, and big-band music, building their own songbook of original dance tunes. Sixteen years later, BBVD is a veteran force that to this day adds new fans by the roomful every time they play.



### Curtis Salgado

Curtis' irresistible dance tunes, a propulsive rhythm section, and harmonica prowess help fortify his reputation as one of the best soul singers on the planet. Today, with multiple solo CDs and high accolades from peers and fans alike, Bozeman has the rare

opportunity to see and hear this musical icon who helped build the contemporary blues and soul scene. Based in Portland, Oregon, Curtis was the inspiration for the characters in the "Blues Brothers" sketches, albums, and films made famous in the late '70s. He was voted 2010 Soul-Blues Male Artist of the Year at the 31<sup>st</sup> annual Blues Foundation's Blues Music Awards in Memphis, Tennessee.



### Fishtank Ensemble

Fishtank Ensemble formed in 2005 and is one of the most thrilling live performances in the music scene today. Consisting of four fun and diverse virtuosos playing a wide range of styles, from gypsy and Romanian to French and flamenco, the band has been

## Missoula Children's Theatre Presents: *Robin Hood*

The Missoula Children's Theatre (MCT) provides a week-long residency starring 50–60 of local students in a full-scale musical. MCT has been touring for 35 years. Annually, MCT visits nearly 1,300 communities in all 50 states, three Canadian territories and five provinces, and 16 countries. A little red truck pulls into town with everything it takes to mount a full-scale musical production—except the cast. That's where the children of Gallatin Valley come in. Monday, they're cast as characters. By Saturday, they've gained character—the kind that really counts.

The show is rehearsed throughout the week, and a public performance is presented on Saturday. For the Sweet Pea Festival, the Missoula Children's Theatre will be performing an original adaptation of *Robin Hood*. MCT's mission is the development of life skills in children through participation in the performing arts. MCT will also hold three workshops for children. See schedule for more details.

The final show on Sunday will be Shakespeare in the Parks performing a joyous and fantastical comedy: *A Midsummer Night's Dream*.

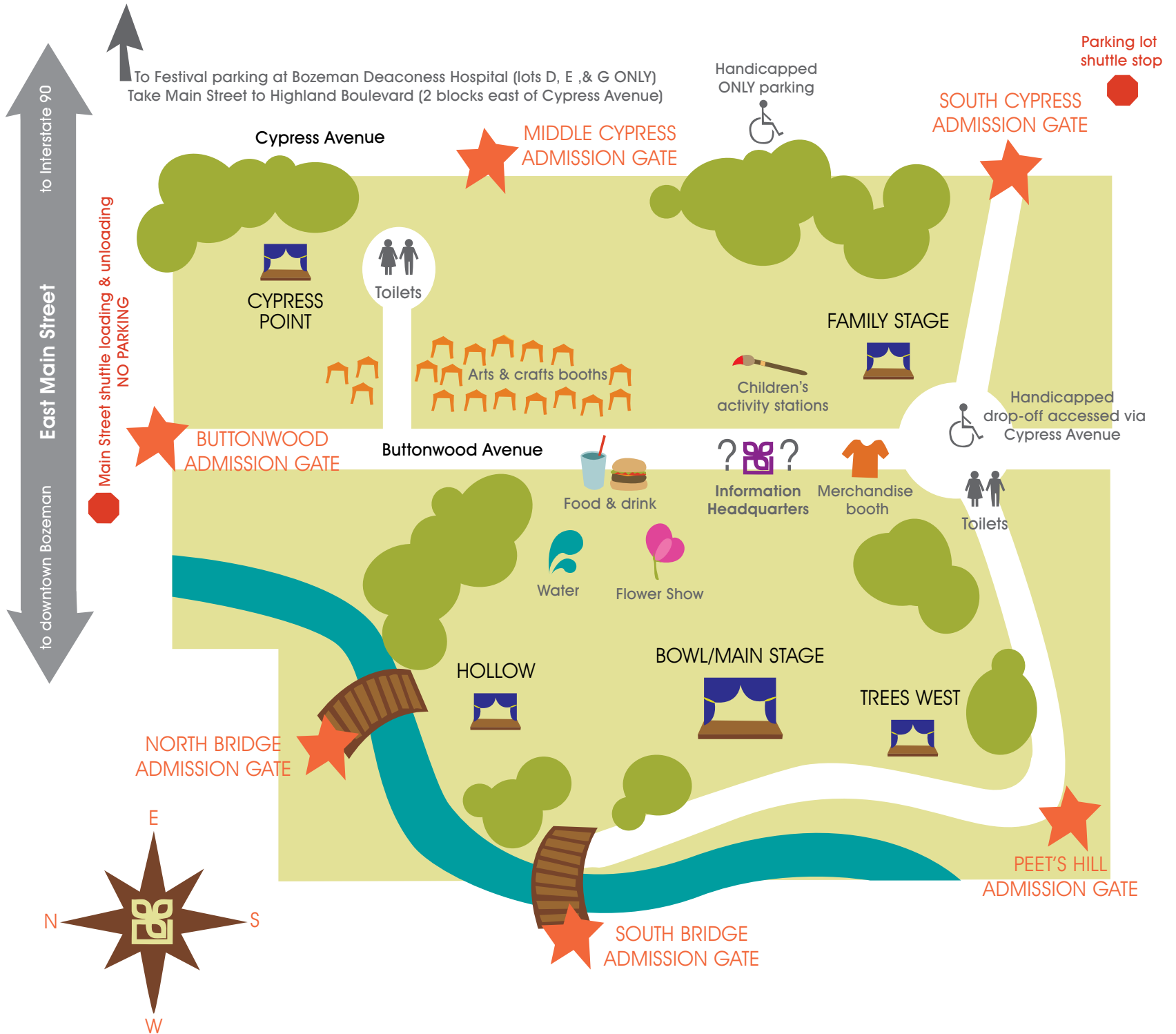

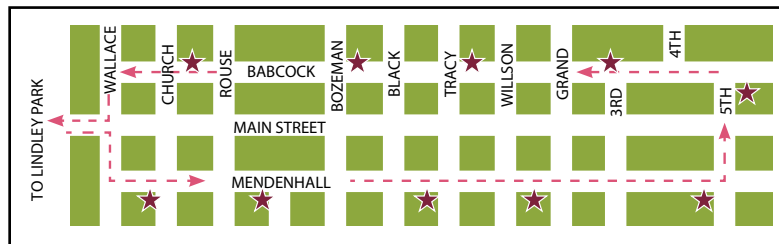
## Main Street Shuttles

Free shuttle buses run to and from Lindley Park approximately every 30 minutes. Routes run east on Babcock and west on Mendenhall, stopping on the south side of Babcock and the north side of Mendenhall at signs reading “Sweet Pea Bus Stop.” Buses will only stop when people are waiting. Hours are:

Friday 8/6 ..... 4pm–11pm

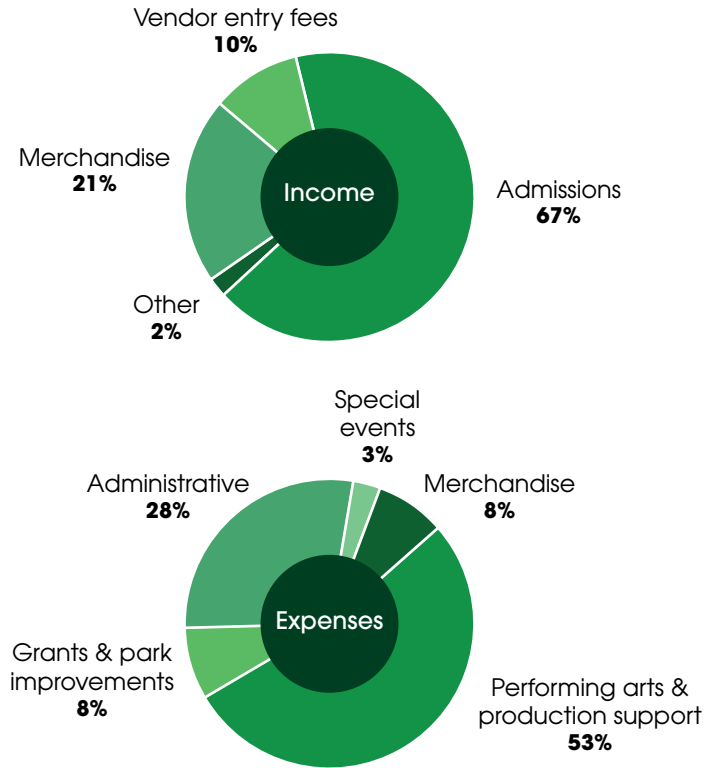
